SHOW Time - The Canadians

Show time is just around the corner. The show program is included with this

Newsletter so you can plan in advance the show classes you may wish to enter. There have been a few changes in the program as well.

Horticulture: **Section I – Collections Class 43. Collection of 3 Stems**, registered lilies from any division hybridized by Canadian Hybridizers, *Eligible for the Canadian Hybridizers' Award*.

This particular class sees few entries so it one you should consider:

The class requirements are:

a) 3stems of lilies from any division

b) Each lily has to be registered. A registered lily is one that is listed and described in ***The International Lily Register and Checklist***. The register/checklist is on line and there are copies of it at the show. Also lily catalogues usually indicate if the bulb is registered. A named bulb is NOT necessarily a registered one so it is best to check carefully

c) Each lily has to be a hybrid developed by a Canadian. Over the years CPLS has sold many bulbs that have been hybridized by Canadians and are registered. The following is a list of lilies that are registered Canadian Hybrids and have been in the CPLS sales lists over the years. You may have some of these lilies in your garden, possibly a trophy winning collection!!

Here is a list of some lilies that meet the criteria of – Canadian Hybrid and Registered. Many of these lilies have been offered in CPLS bulb sales over the years, so you may have them in your garden. Check your garden and enter that prize winning collection!
